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Store Hours

Stores in Germany are not open as long as stores in the U.S. From Monday through Saturday, stores open between 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. in the morning and close at 8:00 p.m. at night. Smaller stores often close at 6:00 or 7:00 p.m. during the week and early afternoon on Saturdays. Stores are generally closed on Sundays.

History Up Close

When you walk through Regensburg's Old Town, you are walking through the middle of history. Most of the buildings date back to the Middle Ages. Many of them are over 700 years old. There are even ruins from the Roman fortress built over 1,800 years ago.



A short walking tour of the three most important landmarks begins with **St. Peter's Cathedral**. Construction of the cathedral began in 1260 and took almost 600 years to complete. The two spires weren't added until the 19th century. Take the opportunity to go inside and enjoy a few moments of calm in the interior of this majestic building.


Walking north from the cathedral, you reach the banks of the Danube. Here is where the giant **Stone Bridge**, built between 1135 and 1146, arches across the river. For hundreds of years the bridge was the only bridge between Ulm and Vienna that offered a reliable means to cross the Danube. In the middle of the bridge you will find the "Bruckmandl" (the bridge man), a small statue that has been looking up at the cathedral since the 15th century. Legend has it that he represents the master bridge builder who made a bet with the

cathedral's architect about who would finish their structure first. Right at the beginning of the bridge, you find the **World Heritage Visitor Center** with its interactive exhibition. Open 365 days a year from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. – No entrance-fee.

Discover two thousand years of history: You can learn a lot about everyday life in the city, about the people, their daily routine, their beliefs as well as the impressive buildings which have stood the test of time. With the bridge at your back, you continue up the narrow Brueckstraße directly up to the Goliathhaus. On the façade of the building you find a giant mural representing the story of David and Goliath. Turning right on the Goliathstraße, you cross a small open square, the Kohlenmarkt (Charcoal market) and reach the **Old Town Hall**. This building was, at one time, not only the residence of the city government but also housed the Perpetual Imperial Assembly from 1663 to 1806, where rulers and ambassadors from all over Europe met to discuss matters.

Today the Old Town Hall is home to a museum, the Reichstagsmuseum, including the eerie, yet fascinating, ancient torture chamber in the cellar of the town hall.

To see more of Regensburg's treasures we recommend a guided tour.

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
Shopping in Regensburg: *No Wish Left Unfulfilled*

A shopping tour in Regensburg leaves no wish unfulfilled. The city offers large shopping malls and specialty retail stores just like those found at home.

The Old Town, however, offers a very special shopping experience. Here you will find many small, lovingly run shops. Each one set like a little jewel in the historical ambience of the Old Town. Most of the stores in Germany accept credit cards even if this is not announced with a sticker on the door, the exception often being very small shops. If you are unsure about this, don't hesitate to ask the shopkeeper!

The Old Town of Regensburg combines, in a unique way, the ambience of historical architecture with the pleasure of modern shopping. A variety of unique Regensburg shops are located side by side next to stores of international chains and large department stores. The many restaurants, cafés and bars offer treats to satisfy every palate. In the Old Town, you can combine a day of sightseeing with the fun of shopping. Strolling through the narrow streets and alleyways, the visitor will quickly understand why Regensburg is called "Italy's most northern city".

The Donau Einkaufszentrum, Alex-Center, KÖWE Einkaufszentrum and Regensburg Arcaden

The **Donau Einkaufszentrum** in the north of Regensburg was one of the first American style malls in Germany. Today, Regensburg's biggest mall offers a variety of 140 shops, specialty stores and cafés. From fashion to entertainment electronics, toys and books, from flower and garden supplies to cosmetics, here you can find everything you need. Restaurants, cafés and specialty food shops make certain that you don't go hungry while shopping. With 3,000 free parking spaces, parking is easy.

Regensburg South

All stores provide plenty of free parking. You can get there easily by taking the Autobahn: A3 and then Exit (Ausfahrt): Universität.

Save with the *Regensburg CARD*

The **Regensburg CARD** makes a visit to the World Heritage City even more attractive. The card offers guests discounts and rebates for many cultural facilities and leisure activities. In addition, the card holder can use RVV's public transportation for free.



Depending on the visitor's needs, there are cards **for 24 or 48 hours**, cards for individuals and families. A guest can quickly save a few euros even on just a short day visit. The 24-hour card helps you save money during a leisurely visit. In the morning you can park your car and take the bus to your sightseeing destinations as often as you want. A boat trip on the Danube, a guided city tour with "KultTouren", a visit to the "Kunstforum" art museum and then letting the day end with a JazzClub jazz concert will save you more than four euros – not including other discounts.



The card can be purchased at the **Tourist Information Center** in the Altes Rathaus in the city center. (For address and contact information see the card in the front cover.) An information pamphlet in English comes with every card.



Clinics with the Highest Level of Health Care

Regensburg medical clinics have an excellent reputation worldwide

Regensburg is an important medical treatment location for U.S. citizens in the Oberpfalz. The city ranks with the Regional Medical Center in Landstuhl near Kaiserslautern, the largest hospital outside of the U.S., according to Dr. Ludwig Hecht, a doctor with a certification from the Pentagon. For over 21 years, Dr. Hecht has been treating U.S. Army personnel in the Oberpfalz. U.S. Army personnel and their families receive top treatment throughout

the world, however, "there is more distance in the relationship between doctor and patient in the USA".

Is personal attention a criterion for choosing medical treatment? "I think it does indeed play a role when everything else is functioning equally well", believes Dr. Hecht. That is certainly the case in Regensburg: The clinics are able to cover almost the entire spectrum of the medical care portfolio and their influence extends far beyond the region of Eastern Bavaria.

Regensburg's Beer tradition

Did the Ancient Romans Brew Beer?

Did the ancient Romans brew beer? Historians are divided on the question. What is beyond doubt is that good beer has a long tradition in Regensburg. And that in this city it is possible to drink for a good cause. Because the three breweries in operation today all belong to charitable organizations.

The year 179 AD is generally accepted as the date of the foundation of Regensburg, when the Emperor Marcus Aurelius erected the Roman fortress of Castra Regina. Around the legionnaires' encampment, farmsteads emerged to provide the soldiers and civilian population with provisions. Within the modern city limits, archaeologists have discovered the remains of a Roman agricultural building which at first some took to be a brewery. Among other things

a well, a fire-stead, a kind of grinding basin and a roasting chamber were uncovered – and that meant the oldest brewery north of the Alps? Perhaps. Other historians see the buildings as evidence that the Romans brought viniculture and their methods of wine production to the Danube.

But whether it began with the Romans, or with later inhabitants of the city, beer has been brewed in Regensburg for a very long time. As recently as 1900 there were still around 40 breweries within the city limits. Three are still operating today, charming the locals and visitors from near and far with their beer specialities.

Kneitinger


Tradition dating back to 1530

At the Kneitinger headquarters in Kreuzgasse in the old town of Regensburg, beer has been brewed since 1530. For 115 years the brewery was in the possession of the Kneitinger family before it was placed in the hands of a charitable foundation.

The brewery inns, steeped as they are in history, have left their mark on Regensburg's tradition of hostelry. Everyone from the mayor to the street-sweeper gathers in the Kneitinger tavern on Arnulfsplatz.

Dicker Mann Restaurant

This quaint restaurant-pub in the heart of the Old Town is known for its historical ambience. From the outside you are drawn in by its impressive architecture – the tower-like gabled roof resting on Tuscan half-pillars, and once inside, you are captivated by its unique atmosphere. In summer, the Mediterranean flair can be felt while sitting in the courtyard or the idyllic Krebsgasse.

Bischofshof

a success story from the Oberpfalz

The Bischofshof brewery is inseparably linked to the complex of buildings that gave it its name. Immediately beside the cathedral lies the historical bishop's court with the Bischofshof restaurant, still today a jewel of Regensburg's gastronomy and hostelry. The first beginnings of the brewery are attested in the Middle Ages, when the dry throats of the artisans who built Regensburg cathedral required fresh beer. Today the brewery's profits go to the training of priests in the diocese of Regensburg.

Regensburg's oldest brewery lies on the north bank of the Danube, in Stadtamhof. It is part of the complex attached to St. Catherine's Retirement Home, the "Katharinenspital". This care home for elderly citizens was founded in 1220 as a joint project of the bishop and the people

of Regensburg. Still today, St Catherine's continues this tradition, building a trust fund for the care of senior citizens. Today the retirement home and the Spitalgarten, one of the most beautiful beer gardens in Germany, are part of a single group of buildings.



There are many Roman remains in Regensburg, like the gate of the fortress, the "Porta Praetoria". But did the Romans brew beer?

Forever Young Festival 2017:

Classic Rock in the "engine shed"

After two successful years, the Forever Young Festival 2017 takes this popular event into a third round. On the second weekend in March, the old railway engine shed once again becomes a rock venue.

The concept of Forever Young is unique in Germany: original music of the 50s, 60s and 70s performed by musicians who themselves remember the early days of the good old rock 'n' roll. The bands may not have big names, but they all share a passion for rock. The aim is to rekindle the old love of music, and let the sparks of the 50s, 60s and 70s ignite in the hearts of the audience. In March, for the third time, Forever Young gives die-hard musicians the ideal platform: an opportunity to meet again and perform to an enthusias-

Thurn und Taxis Palace Dramatic Festival

Stars on the Stage in Regensburg

Since its inaugural season in 2003, the Thurn und Taxis Palace Dramatic Festival has lavished on its audiences an outstanding and varied programme. Top stars from Germany and around the world ensure a unique mixture of classic and pop. Over the years, the event has become a fixed part of the German festival landscape. The Vienna magazine Festspiele lists it in the "Top Ten" of the finest dramatic festivals in the world.

The magnificent backdrop to the festival is provided by the St. Emmeram Palace and its park on the edge of the historic Old Town of Regensburg. In the intervals, or before and after the performances, members of the audience can stroll through the palace gardens, enjoying the colourful lampions, atmospherically illuminated fountains and palace arcades, and dine under snow-white pagoda tents in the festival restaurant, or in the stylish bars and lounges.

The history of the palace of St. Emmeram stretches back into the eighth

century. A community of monks formed around the grave of the bishop and martyr Emmeram, growing into a thriving monastery which survived on this spot until 1810. Building works in the 19th and 20th centuries have transformed the monastery into a princely palace, though without losing its monastic character. The palace contains an early and high gothic cloister, built between the 12th and 14th centuries with an impressive coherence of style.

Getting to Regensburg

There are many ways to get to Regensburg. Whether you are traveling by car or by train, here are some of the best routes and train connections.

Grafenwöhr

Distance: approx. 75 miles (120 km).

By car: Driving time approx. 1,5 hrs

Route:

- Take Bundesstraße (Federal Highway) B470 approx. 7.5 miles direction of Weiden.
- At Autobahn Junction Weiden West take Autobahn A93 to Regensburg.
- Drive approx. 55 miles south on A93.

→ Take one of the exits: Regensburg-Pfaffensteine, Regensburg West or Königswiesen, follow signs to Zentrum (Downtown).

By train: Travel time approx. 1 hr.

Depart: Weiden Hbf (Main Station).

Arrive: Regensburg Hbf (Main Station).

Hohenfels

Distance: approx. 25 miles (40 km).

By car: Driving time approx. 35 min.

Route:

- Drive to Autobahn A3 (Junction Beratzhausen/ Parsberg/ Velburg).
- Take Autobahn A3 direction Regensburg/Passau.
- Drive approx. 15 miles south on A3.
- At Autobahn Junction Regensburg (Autobahnkreuz Regensburg) keep right and follow signs to Autobahn A93 direction Weiden/Regensburg.

Arrive: Regensburg Hbf (Main Station).
Change trains depending on connection either in Weiden, Nürnberg or Neukirchen.




